Brief Itinerary

Day 1: Sunday, April 6 - B, D

We will depart Grand Rapids and drive as far as Berea, Kentucky, having lunch (on own) along the way. Once there, we will check in to the Historic Boone Tavern and have an amazing dinner at their fine dining restaurant.

Day 2: Monday, April 7 - B, L, D

After breakfast at the hotel, we will head towards Linville, North Carolina to visit Grandfather Mountain. At 5,946 feet, it is the highest peak on the eastern escarpment of the Blue Ridge Mountains and has a suspension bridge at the top for the brave! We will have a picnic lunch there and an educational Blue Ridge Mountain tour. Then we will head toward The Biltmore, stopping for an amazing dinner at The Red Rocker Inn. The Red Rocker is a cozy little Bed and Breakfast with a charming atmosphere. Tonight we will be staying at The Biltmore Estate Inn.

Day 3: Tuesday, April 8 - B, L

Today will be spent exploring the Biltmore. We will start with a guided tour (on our bus) of the beautiful grounds at the Estate, then you will be able to take a self-guided audio tour of the house at your leisure. Lunch will be at the Stable Inn. You will have plenty of time to explore the grounds on your own, shop and do some wine tasting.

Day 4: Wednesday, April 9 - B, D

We will depart the Biltmore this morning and have a guided tour of Asheville, North Carolina and have lunch at the Grove Arcade Public Market (on own) before departing for Gatlinburg, Tennessee. We will check into the Park Vista Hotel, which sits up on the mountain, overlooking the town of Gatlinburg. Tonight we will be eating at The Abbey at the Heartland Chapel.

Day 5: Thursday, April 10 - B

Today you will have the entire day on your own to explore the town of Gatlinburg. This town has an amazing public, free trolley system that will allow you to get to anywhere in the town you would like to go. (We will give you maps, trolley schedules and ideas of things to do but we really recommend finding things before getting there. There are too many things to do in this adorable town to list.) Lunch and dinner are on your own.

Day 6: Friday, April 11 - B, D

We will depart Gatlinburg and head towards Pigeon Forge to have time for shopping and lunch at The Island. We will then start our drive home, stopping in Florence Kentucky to enjoy the Drury Inn's kickback cocktail hour and dinner.

Day 7: Saturday, April 12 - B

This morning, we will go to Jungle Jim's International Market in Cincinnati for a bit before heading home. Jungle Jim's offers more gift shops, boutiques, restaurants and conveniences than any other mega store in the region. Stop in for an hour or make a day of it. However you do it, shopping at Jungle Jim's is an experience you won't forget! We will be stopping for lunch on your own and should arrive in Grand Rapids at approximately 5:00pm.
