#### **Brief Itinerary**

#### Day 1: Sunday, Nov 17 (B, D)

We will depart early this morning and make our way toward New Orleans. We will stop for our signature breakfast, and lunch (on your own) along the way. Tonight will be spent in Sikeston MO, with dinner included at the famous Lambert's Cafe - "Home of the Throwed Rolls".

#### Day 2: Monday, Nov 18 (B)

Today we will travel the rest of the way to New Orleans, arriving in the evening to meet our local guide. We will be staying at the Four Points Sheraton while we are in New Orleans. You will have the evening to get dinner, and explore the French Quarter on your own. The French Quarter sits on a crescent in the Mississippi River on some of the highest ground in New Orleans.

#### Day 3: Tuesday, Nov 19 (B, D)

After breakfast this morning, we will take a comprehensive city tour to help us get to know New Orleans better. After our tour, we will go to Mardi Gras World, where you'll get an overview of the history of Mardi Gras in New Orleans before continuing through the float den, where artists work year-round to build spectacular floats and props. The National WWII Museum, formerly known as The National D-Day Museum, is a military history museum, dedicated to telling the story of the American experience in the war that changed the world. #### Day 4: Wednesday, Nov 20 (B, L, D)

Today we will visit The Laura Plantation. Here, on the banks of the Mississippi River, at one historic farm surrounded by fields of sugarcane, you will find the difference that exemplifies Creole Louisiana. We will tour the newly remodeled Big House, the 200-year-old sugar plantation homestead with a visit into the three gardens, and one of the cabins of the enslaved people. Lunch will be included at Frenier Landing before we head out on a Louisiana Swamp Boat Tour, where we will see how the Cajuns of the Bayou survive and live in harmony with the swamps, and look for the wildlife that populates the area. In the late afternoon, we will return to the hotel to freshen up before we enjoy a Natchez Steamboat Dinner and Jazz Cruise on the Mississippi River.
