Day 1 - June 1, 2026 - Monday - D

We'll depart Tri County Middle School at 5:45 am this morning for our exciting tour to the East Coast and Washington D.C.! Our first night will be spent in Fairfield, New Jersey.

Day 2 - June 2, 2026 - Tuesday - CB, L, & D

Today will be spent exploring the "Big Apple". We start with a ferry ride from New Jersey across the Hudson River to NYC. We will walk around the 9/11 memorial and reflecting pools, followed by a 60-second elevator ride to the 100th floor of the One World Observatory for breathtaking views of NYC. After a double decker ride through the city and some lunch we take heart-stopping thrill ride on a 70-foot speedboat, called The Beast, out to view the Statue of Liberty. Finally we will have some time in Times Square and dinner at Planet Hollywood before ending our night with the hit Broadway Show, The Outsiders.

Day 3 - June 3, 2026 - Wednesday - CB, L, & D

After breakfast at our hotel we will see Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, and visit the National Constitution Center. We will have a box lunch before heading off to Washington D.C.. Once in D.C., we will visit some of our nations memorials before having dinner at the Hard Rock Cafe and then head to our hotel for the night.

Day 4 - June 4, 2026 - Thursday - CB, L, & D

Today, we start out by testing our spy skills at the International Spy Museum. There will be some time to visit a couple Smithsonian Museums before heading out to Arlington National Cemetery to see the Changing of the Guard Ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Next we will visit the Pentagon mall for dinner and some shopping. To end the night, we will visit some additional memorials.

Day 5 - June 5, 2026 - Friday - CB, L, & D

This morning we head off to Gettysburg. We arrive to Soldier Cemetery to hear Lincolns famous speech before heading for lunch. Next we will take time to visit the Gettysburg Visitor Center to see the Cyclorama, then depart for guided tours of the historic battlefields. Lastly we will have dinner at the Farmhouse Restaurant at The Barn Resort before heading to the hotel for some swim time.

Day 6 - June 6, 2026 - Saturday - CB, L, & D

This morning we will visit the Jennie Wade House and the Shriver House, where we will learn what it was like to be a civilian during the Battle of Gettysburg. The afternoon and evening, we'll enjoy the amusement rides at Hershey Park! Afterwards, we will re-board our motorcoach and head for home.

Day 7 - June 7, 2026 - Sunday

We will arrive back in West Michigan at approximately 9:30 am.

Reservations, Deposits, Final Payments: Reservations will be accepted on a first come/first served basis with a deposit of \$100.00 made payable to Countryside Tours, Inc. Reservation coupon and check must be sent to Countryside Tours, Inc., P.O. Box 48, Sand Lake, Michigan 49343-0048. Final payment will be due on, or prior to, March 31, 2026. Late payments will be assessed a penalty of \$25.00.

Insufficient Fund Checks: There will be a \$30.00 charge for checks with insufficient funds.

Tour Cost: The tour cost as advertised in this brochure is based on current costs and tariffs in effect at the time of printing. Should these change, an adjustment (either way) will result. If the advertised tour cost is increased by more than 5%, you may cancel within 10 days of notification and receive a full refund.

Cancellations and Refunds: Cancellations MUST be made in writing (email is acceptable) to our office. For cancellations on or prior to the March payment deadline there will be a full refund less an administrative fee of \$50.00. For cancellations received after that date there will be no refund of the \$100.00 deposit. No-shows for your Spring Mandatory Meeting (without permission) will be dropped from the tour and the deposit will be forfeited. Cancellations after the March payment deadline are as follows: Cancellations received 30 days before the trip date will receive a 50% refund; Cancellations received 14 days before the trip date will receive a 25% refund; Cancellations received seven days before the trip or no-shows will receive no refund.

Broadway Theater Tickets: If your school's itinerary includes Broadway Theater Tickets, the cost of the ticket will be non-refundable after October 8th 2025. (\$60)
